

Minutes of the meeting held on Monday 5th February, of the Swim England South West Region Water Polo Technical Meeting, at the Regional Headquarters in Willington.

1. Apologies

2. Question & Answer Session – Swim England – Suzy Stevenson & Norman Leighton

10. Regional Academy Update

10.1. Male Head Coach

10.1.1. On Sunday 14th January at the Region's Water Polo Championships at Millfield, Sue Dors Presented John Spicer with his Coach of the Year Award from Swim England South West Region, and congratulations were passed on to John who then went on to win the national award for Coach of the Year by Swim England, and was presented his awarded at a national awards evening held in Birmingham.

As a former player and now CSWPC Junior coach for many years, John has been developing and enthusing CSWPC, South West and National players for many years in the sport of Water Polo. He is attributed to having brought on the most number of regional and National Age Group Players in the county and indeed his peers in the country.

As a senior coach he not only holds classes for CSWPC players, 4 times a week, manages the various league and tournament for ages 2004 to 2001 Age group, both at local level and Midland League, and NAGS he also acts as senior coach at national levels as part of NAGS and as their senior SW regional coach and as NAGs WP coach for selection, Training and camps.

John has been instrumental in starting and running Cheltenham's After School Water Polo Sessions which has, and continues to, allow prospective new players the experience of water polo training at a cost which is not prohibitive to any financial demographic. His teams have excelled at every level and you will see Cheltenham and South West players that started under Johns watch at every level of water polo, from the newest Junior to the most senior England and GB players both boys and girls, men and women. He has worked tirelessly for the sport of Water Polo and during a time of ongoing austerity continues to bring in new players to a Healthy and thriving club.

As a senior coach he mentors many of our players and coaches and I believe there will not be one coach or Water Polo official in the U.K. who has not either had interaction or advice from this fine man. Whilst I could list his achievements in the last 12 months, I believe this nomination should be seen on Johns many merits, mentoring achievements and exceptional dedication to our sport for club, country, player, and parent at both Local and National level and is well over due. Without complaint, with a smile and sometimes a loud voice and a shout, his players would swim the world for their coach and as a parent of one such player I think an award of this type is well over due to coach John Spicer of Cheltenham Swimming and Water Polo Club.

Congratulations John. John Spicer reported that all was still going well. They had over 50 in attendance.

10.1.2. Luke Bray would be approached to see if he was still willing to assist.

10.1.3. Lee Barnes of Cheltenham had also agreed to assist John with running the boys.

- 10.2. Female Head Coach
 - 10.2.1. Simon Tomlinson reported that he needed more numbers to attend. He put in a request that he needed further assistance from coaches.
- 10.3. Academy Administrator
 - 10.3.1. Colin Hunt agreed that everything was running well although further equipment as needed and this would be talked about in Any Other Business.
- 10.4. 2018/19 Plan
 - 10.4.1. It was said that in 2018 there would be eighty sessions run, and would move from Hengrove to Millfield.
 - 10.4.2. The sessions were planned for September, October, November and December in 2018; and January, February, March and April, missing out May because of exams, and then the final one in June. The age groups would be for 2002-2006 including the 2001 age group who were in National Squads to enable them to keep up their quota of hours required.

11. Finance Report 2017/18 & Budget 2018/19

- 11.1. Phil Garrard presented the finance report (copy in appendixes).

12. Training Courses

- 12.1. Team Managers (Module 1) – 28th Feb 2018– Regional Office
 - 12.1.1. Was still scheduled to be held at the Regional Headquarters and was fully booked.
- 12.2. Referees Course – WSM – Nov 2017 – Feedback
 - 12.2.1. Mike Coles reported back that eight candidates had passed their referees' theory and were in the process of doing their practical sessions at the moment.
 - 12.2.2. He was disappointed that he'd had to bow to pressure from the ASA's officials coordinator and could only charge a maximum of £20 per candidate.
 - 12.2.3. He asked the regional board representatives whether the cost of future courses could be funded direct by Swim England South West Board and not come from the water polo budget, the same as was happening for swimming referees?
- 12.3. Level 1 Coaches Course – Bristol – March 2018 – Confirmation
 - 12.3.1. Confirmation was given that everything was in place for the course on March 17th and 18th at Hengrove, and notice would be sent out to the water polo fraternity in due course.

13. County Officer Reports

- 13.1. Cornwall
 - 13.1.1. No report forthcoming from Cornwall
- 13.2. Devon
 - 13.2.1. Brian Steer reported that an Under-13s league had been organized in the county, but with Somerset's Taunton also joining in.
- 13.3. Dorset
 - 13.3.1. Chris Pryke spoke of a desperate need for water polo officials in the county and put out a plea for a course to be held sooner than later.
- 13.4. Gloucestershire
 - 13.4.1. John Spicer did not have a lot to report other than City of Bristol Harlequins had represented Gloucestershire at the recently held inter-county event at Millfield.
- 13.5. Somerset
 - 13.5.1. Mike Coles reported that Weston-super-Mare had won the senior Somerset League competition held at a tournament in Taunton. Frome were second and Taunton third.

- 13.5.2. He further reported that the Somerset team were ecstatic at winning the inter county senior men's tournament held in January and that the very large trophy had taken up residence in Weston-super-Mare's local headquarters.
- 13.6. Wiltshire
 - 13.6.1. No report from Wiltshire.

14. Reports from following officers:

- 14.1. Management Board Rep
 - 14.1.1. Roger Downing reported that the water polo budgets had improved dramatically under the new resigns management.
 - 14.1.2. It was being looked into regarding members who join during October, November and December where they had to pay full year's monies for just three months.
 - 14.1.3. The meeting was informed that there were major changes in regarding data protection issues for clubs and counties, and that all should look to see if they comply.
- 14.2. Development Officer
 - 14.2.1. Most of the report from the development officer, Mike Coles, had already been covered in previous minutes.
- 14.3. Masters Rep
 - 14.3.1. A masters team was being put together to enter an event in Liverpool. Further details would be given as soon as available.
- 14.4. Officials Officer
 - 14.4.1. Officials Coordinator Mike Coles again said that most of his report had been covered previously. However he did say that a tremendous strain was being put on officials as regards to the competitions being run by the universities and stressed that they really needed to attend any officials courses to get themselves there own officials.

15. Information from Swim England

- 15.1.1. There was more information coming from water polo to be put on the websites and newsletters than another other discipline.
- 15.1.2. Our Facebook page is also gaining popularity, not just in the South West, but further afield after the recently appointed England coach, Tim Dunsbee, mentioned that he gleaned more information from the South West site than any other medium.

16. Items to communicate and Appoint Comms Officer

- 16.1. Stacey Millet reported that she was getting plenty of information from water polo, but asked if we could make it clearer what competitions were being run by whom.
- 16.2. Mike Coles was happy to be Communications Officer and disseminate information to those necessary

17. AOB

- 17.1. Mike Coles reported that he had been approached by Fine Designs to supply tshirts and hoodies, etc at the November inter counties. It was agreed that we invite them to set up in the foyer of Millfield.
- 17.2. Safeguarding Certification is now transferrable from other disciplines and organisations
- 17.3. More hats and hat hooks were needed for both competitions and academy. Also a ball bag to move the balls around the district.

The total figure is difficult to quantify as not all members are only registered for water polo, as such some of the income arguably should be split with swimming. But the maximum it could be, if all members registered for water polo were water polo only is outlined below;

Why is the Calendar always such a mess?

The calendar is not managed by any single body or organization and each competition is delivered by a separate committee. Swim England and all those involved in delivering competitions, events and the National Squads are now committed to working together to resolve the calendar congestion issues, much of which is dictated by the availability of venues at particular times of year and current competition format demands.

The calendar, National Age Group formats, and time of year of competitions are being reviewed for next year.

Why is NAGs four weekends does anyone consider the cost and Calendar congestion?

The calendar, National Age Group formats, and time of year of competitions are being reviewed for next year.

Why are 16-18-year olds not included in Pathways?

The U17 National Squad and U19 National Squad Programmes ensure that talented 16-18 year olds are very much included in the talent pathway.

What is being done to reinstate the funding lost to Water Polo, or finding new funding; that was lost under your stewardship?

The removal of funding for the talent pathway from UK Sport to British Swimming in 2013 (for the GB National Teams) and then subsequently from Sport England to Swim England in 2017 (for the English National Teams), is linked to a lack of 'world and Olympic medal potential' of the national water polo teams. Until the National Teams are able to compete on the world stage, or the investment parameters of the funding organisations change, there will not be a return to the previous levels of funding for the water polo talent pathway.

It is important to note that the removal of funding to Swim England, only applies to funding for water polo talent programmes. Sport England and Swim England have both committed funding for participation programmes in water polo for the next four years.

Partnership agreements to reduce the costs of the talent pathway, individual athlete-funding applications, squad fundraising activity and sponsorship sourcing for national squads is underway to tackle the increased cost to talented athletes and continue the delivery of the talent pathway.

Due to lack of funding is Water Polo becoming an elitist sport and if not why not?

There is a cost to talented athletes, as there is for all other sports. It could be the case that there are many who can afford to commit to the talent programme that do, rather than the most talented. However selection is always based on being the best athlete, not on whether an individual can afford to participate or not and support is always sought for those in financial difficulties.

With regards to the wider membership of water polo, there are many examples of inner city clubs who attract water polo players from wide socio-economic backgrounds that suggest that water polo is not necessarily an elitist sport at all levels. But that elite sport, is elitist.

TYR fund Swim England – why do GB Water Polo athletes have to purchase all TYR branded kit?

TYR are the official kit providers for both Swim England and British Swimming, as such up to 3 x GB water polo squads (depending if it is the year of competition or not) are provided with a TYR kit package completely free of charge as part of the kit provider agreement. Technical kit (trunks/suits and caps) and any optional kit that the squad request, is then purchased from TYR at a heavily subsidised rate.

Has Water Polo considered leaving Swim England?

The Swim England Water Polo Management Group, supported by external consultancy, carefully considered the outcome of splitting away from Swim England and establishing a standalone governing body for water polo. However, as per the financial breakdown above and the operating costs of running as an independent body, it would not be financially viable at this time to break away.

Moreover, the smallest sport that Sport England recognise as a governing body for sport has circa 16,500 members (Rounders) – over twice as many as water polo currently. In order to be a National Governing Body for a sport, Sport England recognition is essential in terms of credibility and access to funding. As such, until water polo membership grows beyond the minimum membership threshold, breaking away from Swim England is not an option.

Has Water Polo considered affiliating to the Swim England like BUCS so that external funding can be sought?

It is increasingly difficult to secure external funding, particularly for a small sport. The largest funder of sport and governing bodies in England comes from Lottery Funding through Sport England, with many National Governing Bodies reliant on 80% funding from this source. However, as stated above, the smallest sport that Sport England currently recognise has 16,500 members and water polo would need to meet this threshold before being able to attract stand alone funding.

Water polo is at liberty to, and is, seeking external funding with the support of the sponsorship agent engaged by Swim England. However, in the current financial climate it is very challenging to find funding. If anyone is aware of any interest from funders or sponsors, please get in touch.

In terms of affiliating to Swim England; water polo is a part of Swim England as the Governing Body and there isn't a need to affiliate nor are there any benefits in doing so.

Unless insurance has been costed it is not an excuse for the above?

Don't understand the question.

What progress is being made for Water Polo to be considered for the Olympics?

Water polo national teams need to qualify through LEN and FINA events to gain entry into the Olympic Games. Progressive steps are being put in place with national squad programmes to build towards this in the future. However, until as a nation we are able to compete with professional countries and place top-8 in the world, this will be an incredibly tough challenge.

Why is Water Polo the only aquatic sport (Swimming, Diving, Open Water and Synchronised Swimming are Included) not represented at the European Championships 2018 in Scotland?

LEN Water Polo deliver the equivalent European Water Polo Championships independently of the combined European Championships, due to the number of teams and venue demands that are involved. In 2018 the equivalent European Water Polo Championships will be in Barcelona, following qualification rounds.

Where is the published selection process for athletes (Scotland's is published on its website)?

Why are GB sessions and training camps not published a year in advance?

The current calendar has published training & competition dates for the next 9 months – Team Managers, Head Coaches and Talent Staff are constantly working to plan as far in advance as possible.

Why are GB sessions not refereed by referees with European experience so that teams can prepare for game situations?

If appropriate scrimmage matches are organised, this is sometimes arranged. However, the current training sessions are mostly focused on technical player & team development.

The cost element can also make this a prohibitive option as athletes bear 80% of the cost of the talent programme, as such any additions in cost are carefully considered.

Why when we have paid coaches in the UK who can commit time to GB teams why do we not utilise them?

Any paid coaches that we are aware of are paid by clubs, independent organisations or Universities. But no coaches are paid for by Swim England or British Swimming. As such, anyone who is willing to give their time to coach national squads should register their interest to get involved by emailing: englandwaterpolo@swimming.org

All those involved in the England and GB National Squad Programmes, give their time voluntarily, including coaching, team management and sports science staff.

Do you think that Water Polo will progress in the UK without results?

Water polo has been steadily growing over the last 18 months, coaching education has improved and entries into domestic competitions are increasing. As such the sport is progressing.

In terms of international competitive results, junior and senior squads are finishing strongly in European smaller nations competitions and the National Squad programmes will continue to try to progress teams. However, as stated above, without significant improvement in 'medal potential', no progress will be made towards regaining a funded programme.

Why is there no standard and prescriptive template for all GB squads provided centrally?

Don't understand the question. However, there are set athlete standards published for entry into England National Squads (<http://www.swimming.org/waterpolo/asa-england-talent-water-polo/>) and athletes will be provided with personal development plans to understand what to work on in order to improve.

How was it decided who was invited for recent England u17 Trials?

Any athletes who achieve athlete standards as published here: <http://www.swimming.org/waterpolo/asa-england-talent-water-polo/> are nominated by their Head Regional Academy Coach to the relevant National Academy squad. From here, talented athletes are further developed and then referred to the relevant National Squad Coach for trial consideration if they achieve the National Academy standards.

In addition to this pathway that will embed over the next two-four years, National Academy Head Coaches will attend relevant Inter Regional Championships to scout players and many squads will also hold open trials for any athletes who achieve these standards and may have been overlooked in the Regional set up.

If you believe that an athlete has not been fully considered, please speak to your Head Regional Academy Coach in the first instance, to ascertain if they are eligible to be nominated to the National Academy or what they should focus on in order to be considered. If it is still not clear why a particular athlete who meets the technical standards, has not been considered, please contact Water Polo Talent Officer, Norman Leighton.
