Name of Fund: **Keeping Strong Fund**

The Keeping Strong Fund has been launched to help people in Gloucestershire that have a disability, mental health challenge or who are experiencing significant mental distress due to the Coronavirus crisis. Funding will be available to help with the cost of purchasing items that make a big difference to keeping a family's physical and mental health strong over the coming weeks. The following are examples of the type of things that funding is available for: Household essentials; Televisions, laptops and tablets; Phone credit and mobile data top up; Access to online courses; Home exercise equipment; Arts and Crafts materials; Family games and play materials.

Name of Fund: **Emergency Fund**

The Emergency Fund has been launched to support frontline organisations operating in Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly that are working with people who may be affected by the COVID-19 outbreak. Grants of between £500 and £3,000 are available to primarily support: the ongoing needs of vulnerable people to ensure that their health and wellbeing is maintained; activities that support vulnerable people self-isolating (the elderly, people with pre-existing medical conditions etc); foodbanks and organisations working to combat hardship caused by the pandemic including child hunger; Community response coordination; Volunteer costs for new and existing organisations responding to the effect of the pandemic; Additional costs of working remotely and adapting services delivered in the wider community.

Name of Fund: **Devon Coronavirus Response and Recovery Fund**

The Devon Coronavirus Response and Recovery Fund has been set up to support local charities and community organisations across Devon who are supporting vulnerable groups affected by the coronavirus outbreak. The fund will continue to evolve and currently supports the following: Groups that support the ongoing needs of vulnerable people to ensure their health and wellbeing is maintained; Groups that support vulnerable people self-isolating; foodbanks and organisations working to combat hardship caused by the pandemic including child hunger; Community response coordination; Volunteer costs for new and existing organisations; additional costs of working remotely and adapting services delivered in the wider community; Additional support as required for emotional support, mental health and bereavement support.

Name of Fund: The Dorset Coronavirus Community Fund

The Dorset Coronavirus Community Fund aims to support local voluntary and community organisations that are helping vulnerable people impacted by the Covid-19 crisis; easing the immediate difficulties communities are facing and supporting their recovery over the coming weeks and months. Currently grants of up to £5,000 are available to charities, constituted community groups, CIC's, Social Enterprises and Parish/Town councils. Priority will initially be given to organisations supporting those most vulnerable to Coronavirus (the over 70's and those with underlying health conditions) and food delivery services where at least 50% of beneficiaries fall within the most vulnerable category.

Name of Fund: Coronavirus Emergency Response Fund

The Gloucestershire Coronavirus Emergency Response Fund provides grants of up to £5,000 to charitable organisations and voluntary and community groups with charitable aims that are based and working in Gloucestershire. The initial focus of the fund is on providing emergency grants to coordinated volunteer programmes, and those picking up extra demand such as foodbanks, counselling services, advice organisations and befriending services, who will play a key role in helping the most vulnerable people in the community who have been impacted as a result of the virus.

Grants of up to £5,000 are available for single organisations and up to £20,000 for partnerships.
