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## South West Snapshot-Swim21

Each month we will be highlighting a relevant topic.
Swim21 is a tool to help you run your club in line with best practice.
It provides clubs with templates and guidance on good club governance. Each month we will take you through the different areas of swim21 that will help you with the running of your club.

## This month we will focus on Constitutions

There are different ways in which you can set up a club and depending on what you do will depend on which constitution you will adopt. Types of set up can include:

- Members club/unincorporated association
- Community Amateur Sports Club (CASC)
- Company
- Charitable incorporated organisation
- Registered charity

Most clubs will be set up as a Members Club or an Unincorporated Organisation. Swim England provide a model club constitution for this set up and update it regularly. We recommend that all clubs regularly review their constitutions. If the last version of your club constitution is older than 2013 then it may not meet the current Swim England guidance and should be reviewed. Club constitution amendments can be adopted at an AGM or SGM
 (please remember that members should be given 28 days' notice of these meetings). Swim England guidance on constitutions can be found if you click here.
